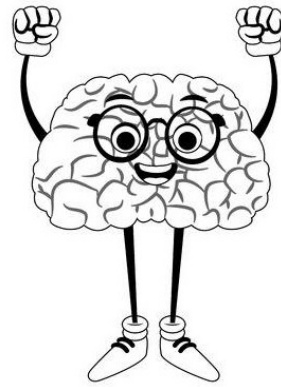

It is located near where you exercise your body.

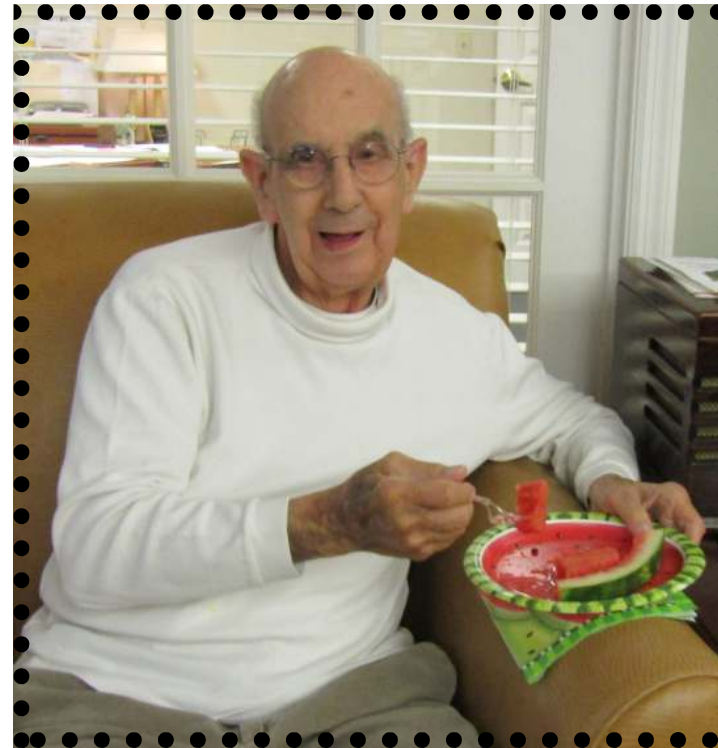
Stop by before or after your body is taken care of and replenish your brain cells.

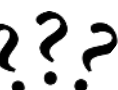
